On their nightly excursions, they get to know the neighboring animals and experience exciting and funny adventures.

The bear has a small problem, but everyone he wants to tell has a solution for him beforehand: he gets wings from the inventor, red shoes from the shoe salesman and pills from the doctor - but no one is interested in what the bear actually wants. But then a small, inconspicuous fly appears ...
